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Weekly Practice (for Kids + Families)

Use this format weekly:

1.  **Read or Tell the Bible Story**
 2.  **Ask the 5 Discovery Questions**
 3.  **Each person shares 1 obedience step**
 4.  **Say: “Who will you tell this to?”**
 5.  **Pray and thank God together**
 6.  **Optional: Sing, memorize verse, or draw the story**
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Memory Verse Ideas (Optional)

You can assign one memory verse per story (or per week), like:

- Genesis 1:1 – “In the beginning, God created...”
- Psalm 119:105 – “Your word is a lamp...”

- John 3:16 – “God so loved the world...”
- Matthew 28:19 – “Go and make disciples...”

Use repetition, movement, songs, or games to help kids learn.



Final Prayer (to use often)

“Jesus, thank You for loving our family.
Help us listen to Your voice and obey Your Word.
Teach us to help others know You too.
Use our home for Your Kingdom. Amen.”

Sample Journal Entry (from Luke 10:25–37)

Story: The Good Samaritan

PARENT & TEACHER COACHING PAGES

Use these weekly guides to help disciple children in your care.

WEEKLY CONVERSATION OUTLINE

1. **Start With Warmth:**
 - “Tell me about your week.”
 - “What made you laugh or feel close to God?”
 2. **Read the Bible Story Together** (or summarize it simply)
 - Ask: “What did you hear?”
 - Help them say it in their own words
 3. **Ask the Discovery Questions:**
 - “What did you learn about God?”
 - “What does God want you to do?”
 4. **Guide the Obedience Plan:**
 - “How will you obey this week?”
 - “Who can you tell this story to?”
 5. **Pray Together:**
 - Let the child pray in their own words
 - You can bless them with your own prayer
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TIPS FOR PARENTS & TEACHERS

1. Keep it Simple

Use short, clear words. Focus on heart response, not theological detail.

2. Be Consistent

Set a regular rhythm (once a week at home, school, or church).

3. Encourage Storytelling

Help children retell the Bible story to family or friends.

4. Celebrate Obedience

Praise small steps of faith, kindness, or courage.

5. Model It Yourself

Share how *you* obeyed God this week too.

6. Involve the Whole Family

Make space at meals, bedtime, or walks for spiritual conversations.

BONUS: SIMPLE STORY SET IDEAS

Use one story per week. Retell it in child-friendly language.
